A project about the EdYOUFest community,
inspired by one of the world's most translated books.



**Mini Project Guide for the
EdYOUFest Control Tower Team**

1. Introduction

EdYOUFest is an international community of educators connected by a shared belief in the power of education, dialogue, culture and human relationships.

To celebrate the diversity of our community, we would like to launch a new participatory project:

The Little Prince Around the World

The project will bring together photographs, languages and personal messages from members of the EdYOUFest community across different countries.

It will become part of a wider section of the EdYOUFest website dedicated to our international community, alongside projects such as the existing **Hello from Around the World** video.

2. Why *The Little Prince*?

The Little Prince is one of the world's most widely translated and internationally recognised books.

Its story crosses national, cultural and linguistic borders, while exploring values that are closely connected to the spirit of EdYOUFest:

- friendship;
- curiosity;
- dialogue;
- responsibility;
- empathy;
- human connection;
- the importance of seeing the world from different perspectives.

The project is therefore not simply about collecting different editions of a book.

It is about using one universal story to represent the many languages, cultures and people that make up the EdYOUFest community.

3. The Main Idea

Members of the EdYOUFest community will be invited to send a photograph of themselves holding an edition of *The Little Prince* in their own language or from their country.

Whenever possible, participants should take the photograph in a place that represents their school, city or country, such as:

- a classroom;
- a school;
- a library;
- a local landmark;
- a meaningful place in their community.

Each photograph will be accompanied by a short personal dedication to EdYOUFest.

The dedication should preferably be written in the participant's own language, together with an English translation.

Participants do not need to send the physical book to EdYOUFest. They only need to send the photograph and the requested information.

4. What Each Participant Will Submit

Each contribution should include:

1. A clear photograph of the participant holding the book, with the cover visible.
2. Full name.
3. City and country.
4. Language of the edition.
5. Local title of *The Little Prince*.
6. A short dedication or message to EdYOUFest in the participant's language.
7. An English translation of the message.
8. Permission to publish the photograph, name and message on the EdYOUFest website and social media channels.

The dedication should be short, personal and connected to education, friendship, culture or the EdYOUFest community.

5. What We Want to Achieve

The project aims to:

- celebrate the cultural and linguistic diversity of EdYOUFest;
- place educators and community members at the centre of the project;
- create a visible representation of the international reach of EdYOUFest;
- strengthen the sense of belonging within the community;
- encourage members from different countries to participate actively;
- create meaningful content for the EdYOUFest website and social media;
- build a growing digital archive of faces, languages and messages from around the world.

Over time, the project should become a visual journey through the EdYOUFest community.

Every photograph will represent a person.

Every book will represent a language.

Every dedication will represent a connection.

6. Website Presentation

The project will be presented on a dedicated section of the EdYOUFest website.

Each participant will have a simple profile including:

- photograph;
- name;
- country and city;
- language;
- local title of the book;
- original dedication;
- English translation.

The page may also include a world map showing the countries and languages already represented.

New contributions can be added gradually, allowing the project to grow together with the EdYOUFest community.

7. Social Media Use

Each new contribution may also become an individual social media post.

A standard post could include:

- the participant's photograph;
- their country and language;
- their dedication to EdYOUFest;
- the English translation;
- the project title and slogan.

Suggested slogan:

One book. Many languages. One global community.

Social media posts should always be published with the participant's permission.

8. Role of the Project Coordinator

One member of the Control Tower Team should be appointed as Project Coordinator.

The coordinator will:

- introduce and promote the project;
- invite members of the community to participate;
- collect photographs, messages and information;
- check that each contribution is complete;
- request corrections or missing details when necessary;
- verify that publication permission has been provided;
- organise the material in a shared archive;
- coordinate with the website and social media teams;
- monitor which countries and languages are already represented;
- encourage participation from new countries and communities.

The coordinator will not need to manage every technical aspect of the website, but will ensure that all material is complete and ready for publication.

9. Editorial Guidelines

To maintain consistency and quality:

- photographs should be clear and well lit;
- the book cover should be visible;
- messages should remain brief and respectful;
- political, commercial or inappropriate content should not be accepted;
- English translations should be checked before publication;
- no contribution should be published without permission;
- EdYOUFest may correct spelling or formatting errors without changing the meaning of the participant's message.

More than one person from the same country may participate, particularly when different languages, regions or editions are represented.

10. The Meaning of the Project

The Little Prince Around the World is not simply a gallery of books.

It is a collection of educators, cultures, languages and friendships.

Through one internationally recognised story, the project will show how people from different parts of the world can remain connected by shared educational values.

This reflects the identity of EdYOUFest:

Together, we are EdYOUFest.

Take a photo with your book in a place that represents your school, city or country and share a short dedication to EdYOUFest in your language (with English translation). The book stays with you – we only need your photo and information.

- ✓ Local title of *The Little Prince*
- ✓ A short dedication to EdYOUFest in your language
- ✓ English translation of the dedication
- ✓ Permission to publish your photo, name and message on our website and social media

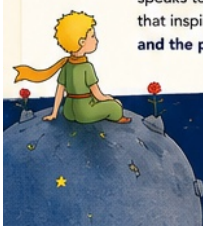
